My dear President,

My best thanks for your kind letter of October

15, and please accept my applogies for not having replied earlier. But I have had talks with various distinguished persons in view of forming an Icelandic Atlantic Unity

Association and obtaining their assent to becoming signatories to the Declaration of Atlantic Unity.

American Ambassador to Iceland, Mr. Bjarni Benediktsson, former Minister for Foreign Affairs and Dr. Gylfi Gislason, Minister of Education. Mrs. Osborn's letter contains the names of 72 Icelanders, but none of these has as yet signed any obligation to become a member of an Icelandic Atlantic Unity Committee, some of them are even persons whom Mrs. Osborn can hardly have met. Very few of them know anything more than Mrs. Osborn has told them, often in a very brief interview, but all of them are very sympathetic. But that is not enough to form such an Association. A meeting must be arranged to discuss the matter.

Because of the Communists - who are very numerous here - the first steps would necessarily have to be taken in quiet in order to avoid their attacks in the beginning. Some persons are doubtful whether Mrs.

Osborn is the right person to sponsor the formation

of such a group. In their opinion the initiative should come from Icelandic side. Before Mrs. Osborn came here, three young editors (one from each of the main organs of the three democratic parties) all of whom have been in the United States, were deliberating on the same or similar step. It would be very desirable if they were allowed to try their hand and to choose the leading personalities which they desire. I think that Mrs. Osborn's list would be very useful to them.

I shall continue to work towards this goal in quiet and there may be some time before I can write to you about the results, but I shall keep you advised. I do sincerely think that the best policy would be the one I have suggested.

The Althing has just convened and has not yet elected the members for the Parliamentary delegation, but it is known that Mr. Johann Hafstein, Bank Director, will be among them.

You will hear from me again.

SENDIRÁÐ ÍSLANDS LONDON. 27. maí 1957. Db. 1.R.3. Gdoi vinur, Pakka þér bréf frá 13. maí um höfuðmynd af föður þínum. Eg var satt að segja ekki inni í málim en Agnar Kl. Jónsson er samvizkusamur embættismaður og hefir haldið til haga afritum af bréfum og frásognum af samtölum, svo að auðvelt var að sjá hvað gerzt hefir í þessu máli. Greinilegt er að myndasmiðurinn, Richard Lee, er mesti mannhundur að eiga við. Hann hefir lofað og lofað að láta steypa myndina, en af einhverjum óskiljan-legum ústæðum aldrei haft manndað í sér til að koma því í verk. Nú hefi ég néð í hann aftur og segist hann vera búinn að koma þessu á rekspöl og að myndin sé nú i bronze-steypunni og verti tilbúin eftir ca. 5-6 vikur. Er þetta er satt finnst mér að svo stöddu rétt að gefa honum þennan eina sjans til að standa við loforð sín. Eg skal merkja í almanakið hjá mér og hóa í hann aftur að fimm vikum liðnum. Hafi þá ekkert gerzt held ég að rétt sé að taka til annarra ráða. Að því er greiðslu snertir segir hann að verkið muni kosta £50 (ekki £45 eins og áður var um talað). Degir hann að þetta stafi af hækkun á vinnu og efni. Eg þráttaði ekki við hann um þetta af því að mér fannst maðurinn evo ómerkilegur að ekki hefði þýtt neitt að benda honum á, að ef hann hefði staðið við gefin loforð þegar fyrst var um betta samið, þá hefði verðið getað orðið £45 eins og upphaflega var um samið. I bessu sambandi get ég glatt þig með því, að £45 sem þú sendir á sínum tíma liggja hér hjá sendi-ráðinu og eru auðvitað tiltæk hvenær sem er. Vona ég að þú samþykkir þenna £5 mismun, ef myndin fæst með bví verši. Eg skal láta big vita hvernig málum er komið að fimm vikum liðnum, nema þú óskir annars. Dear Mr. Benediktsson:

I enclose herewith a Circular Letter which is being sent to all 271 signers of the Declaration in eleven NATO countries.

It seems to us that unless our governments act now to carry out more fully the pledges which they made when they signed the North Atlantic Treaty in 1949 and adopted the Report of the Committee of Three in 1956, the threat to the lives and welfare of all of us will continue unabated. That so little has been accomplished in building up NATO on the non-military side is to some extent the responsibility of all the governments concerned, but primarily of the major NATO powers.

These circumstances place an obligation for leadership on those of us who signed the <u>Declaration</u> of <u>Atlantic Unity</u>. We hope that you, as a leader of opinion in <u>Iceland</u>, will accept this obligation.

In particular, will you - as an individual or member of a delegation - urge implementation of the recommendations of the Committee of Three and point up the urgency of strengthening both military and non-military aspects of NATO among the following groups:

- 1. leaders of your Government
- 2. your Parliament
- 3. your political party

It would be most helpful in coordinating efforts in various countries if you could let your Sponsor hear from you about anything you are able to do in this direction. He is Dr. Alexander Johannesson, Hringbraut 57, Reykjavik.

NATO was born of the will of the west for survival in freedom. Its vigor can be restored if leaders in NATO countries will take the initiative in awakening fellow citizens to the perils of postponing support for NATO's growth.

I also enclose for your information a copy of a letter addressed to your Prime Minister. We hope that the further proposals for Atlantic Unity suggested in that letter will also commend themselves to you. As a former Minister of Foreign Affairs, a leading editor and as Vice-Chairman of the Conservative Party you are in a key position to assist this further effort.

Our Project Director, Mr. Walden Moore, will be in Iceland from August 20 to 24. He will be in touch with Dr. Johannesson and will hope to have an opportunity to talk with you at that time.

Dr. Johannesson will look forward to hearing from you. With appreciation for your understanding and cooperation, in the past, as now, I am,
